and more all on their phones.

Rodney Makes a Miraculous Recovery After Hand Surgery



Eleven-year-old Rodney was cutting into a watermelon at home for a snack for him and his sister. Rodney ended up playing with the knife and the watermelon rind, and unfortunately, the knife slipped, severely damaging all four fingers of his right hand.

Anna Acosta, M.D., a pediatric hand and upper extremity specialist, was consulted to determine the best surgical option to repair his hand. Rodney's

injury was a Zone II Flexor Tendon Injury, and Dr. Acosta performed a complex, multi-digit procedure to repair the flexor tendons, which very few surgeons are specialized enough to perform.

"When he went in for surgery, he was more nervous about not being able to use his hand instead of the surgery itself," Rodney's mother said. "Dr. Acosta really did so much to reassure us that the surgery would be a success and Rodney would be able to use his hand again."



Surgery alone wouldn't give Rodney the full function of his hand. He would need months of rehabilitation sessions. The occupational therapy team at Miller Children's & Women's Hospital, who specializes in hand therapy, developed a recovery plan that led Rodney back to the things he loves, like basketball and playing the trumpet.

While giving gifts, players encouraged the patients they met, reassuring them of how strong they were while undergoing treatment. Cooper, a pediatric patient, was extremely excited to see the players, talking to them about their recent performances and giving them tips for upcoming games.



"This really means so much to me as a parent," said Erin Cannon, Cooper's mother. "Seeing these players take the time out of their busy schedules in between games to visit the patients of the hospital is such a privilege. The best part of this visit is being able to see my son happy during his stay at Miller Children's & Women's Hospital."
